The election process

Elections to the Governing Body: The Annual General Meeting to be held on or before the 30th May every year.

- The period of the first Governing Council will be for five years. The period may be extended by the General Body.
- A retiring member shall be eligible for re-election to the Governing Council.
- The election to the Governing Council shall be held as per the calendar of events, published by the Governing Council from time to time.

General:

- Life members of the InSPA who have enrolled on or before 30.06.2013 are eligible for contesting any post and eligible to cast one vote for office bearer and one vote for state convenor. List of members are available at www.inspa.info. It may also be obtained from the InSPA Secretariat by sending Rs. 100/- by cash or MO.
- Eligible member shall contest for only one post in the election
- Eligible member shall file nomination along with brief resume highlighting his/her contribution to the InSPA about 100 words (If it is more than 100 words the Presiding Officer shall have privilege to reduce it for 100 words) and another 50 words about your plan of action for three year period between 01.04.2014 to 31.3.2016.

Office bearers are to be elected for the period 2014 – 2016:

1. President
2. Vice-President (Two)
3. Secretary
4. Joint secretaries (Two)
5. Treasurer

Election for State Convenors: Election shall be conducted where more than 10 members are available in the particular State. The convenor must be member of his/her own State. State convenors will be nominated by the elected Governing Council members where less than 10 members are available

New Office Bearers: The new office bearers will assume office on 23rd November 2013 at NIEPMD, Chennai and exercise powers from 01.04.2014 to 31.03.2016.

Profile of NIEPMD
